Radical connection is an investment in another child of God. It isn't about who we click with or are comfortable with; it's about who Jesus lays on our hearts to connect with on this part of the journey. We are all connected in the deepest, most profound ways. There isn't a single action, belief, or feeling that doesn't affect all of us. .

Growing deep friendships requires intentional investment over a long period of time—marinating, not seasoning. Radical connection is about forming a deeper bond, a relationship that goes beyond social niceties

We are better and brighter versions of ourselves when we are connected to others. Radical Connection is:

- · rooted in love.
- nourished by prayer.
- nurtured over time.
- marked by belonging.
- strengthened through vulnerability.
- revealed through growing compassion.
- kindness.
- · mutually forgiving.



MADE TO CONNECT

God calls us to do life together (which means making space for friendship in our daily lives,) and He equips us with everything we need:

- attention
- empathy humility
- sacrifice

- authenticity
 forgiveness
 intentionality
 - vulnerability willingness

- compassion
 grace courage
 - honesty
- kindness
- patience

Scientifically, the word radical means a group of atoms behaving as a unit. We might be different, but that shouldn't stop us from intentionally connecting, and discovering common ground.

6 STEPS TO RADICALLY CONNECT WITH OTHERS

- 1. Pray for courage and God's perfect timing.
- 2. Take a risk and invite someone to connect.
- 3. Listen patiently without judgment or agenda.
- 4. Be willing to share something authentic.
- 5. Stay present in the conversation and ask thoughtful questions.
- 6. Keep showing up.

Radical Connection is the willingness to be surprised (even delighted) by people we don't yet know. It's a journey of learning that we are all multi-dimensional. We can be selfish and kind, prickly and generous, extroverted and insecure. We are complicated people. We will fall short. We will hurt and disappoint one another, and we will make mistakes. But we are also loved and loveable.

How can we use the tensions uncovered in growing relationships to deepen our connection, build bridges, and foster healing? We will disagree and have heated discussions, but when we remain committed to the friendship and choose to love one another, we become a little more like Jesus, which changes everything.
